(By the way, my dog Charlie is going to be a co-recipient of this award. He will be attending the banquet, and he's excited because he's never been to the Bellagio before.)

I'm just making people I know aware of this event. If my participation can help raise money for the Foundation, all the better.

## **Citizens Advisory Council VACANCY NOTICE**

### **Clark County is currently taking applications to fill a vacancy on the Sandy Valley Citizens Advisory Council**

Citizens Advisory Council (CAC) is for the remainder of the current term ending December 2014.

The CAC holds public meetings at least once per month. Applicants must be eligible to vote, and live within the Sandy Valley town boundaries.

Functions of the CAC include:

Hearing matters pertaining to the town (long range planning, land use, zoning, public works projects, new ordinances, etc.), providing input regarding these matters to the Board of County Commissioners, forwarding concerns/problems of the residents for resolution by County Staff and disseminating information of interest that it receives from the Clark County Commission and County staff to town residents.

### **Kingston Ranch Hosts Camp Cartwheel**

When the annual kidsøcamp sponsored by the Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation was about to be cancelled due to the carpenter 1 fire at Mt. Charleston, the Foundation turned to Al Marquis, owner of Kingston ranch in Sandy Valley. With only one weekø notice, Al rearranged his schedule and opened his gate to 200 kids and adults July 17-20 and again July 24-27. For four days each week, children with cancer and other life-threatening illnesses enjoyed swimming, horseback riding, archery, arts & crafts, and other activities.

Jeff Gordon, Executive Director of the foundation, expressed his gratitude: øThese kids look forward to camp all year long, and they would have been devastated had we been forced to cancel. Even though my desperate call to Al was at the last minute, he didnøt hesitate. Not only did he say yes, he said heød be honored to host camp for these kids. In addition, Marilyn Gubler at Sandy Valley Ranch opened her facilities for daily lunches. I canøt express how much their generosity meant to NCCF and especially to the kids.ø

Al Marquis explained why he didnøt hesitate. øI canøt say no to childrenø especially these children. They have suffered through trauma that no child should have to go through. This is their chance to enjoy fun activities that other kids take for granted. But camp is far more than that. With the help and guidance of trained, loving counselors, these kids come out of the protective shells theyøve erected around themselves. Over the course of four days, frowns turn into smiles, and folded arms turn into hugs. Itøa miraculous transformation, and Iøam proud to be able to host camp for these deserving children.ø

Jeff Gordon added that Al Marquis did more than simply open his gates. øAl and his dog Charlie were actively involved with the kids every day. They were in the lake swimming. They were singing and dancing with the kids. Due to this love and generosity, Al Marquis will be presented with the Foundationø Community Angel award at our annual dinner at the Bellagio on November 23. By the way, Charlie will be a co-recipient of that award. Al says that Charlie is quite excited about receiving the award øbecause heø never been to the Bellagio before.ø The dinner is the annual fundraiser for the Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation. 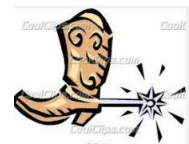

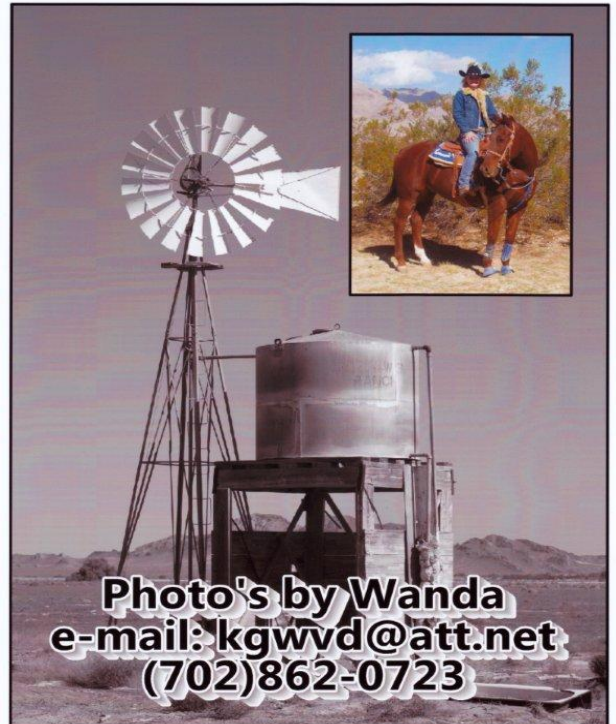
